Fall is finally here. I don't usually rush seasons. In fact, I complain about how fast time flies every month. But this year, I was yearning for the cool days of autumn... the changing colors of the trees against a clear blue sky... the rustle of leaves under my feet... hooded sweatshirts and cardigan sweaters... fresh local apples and cider... hayrides and campfires... mums and pumpkins...

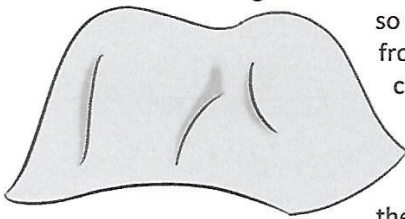


My vision of autumn changed to impatience over the last three weeks of September elevating almost as high as the unseasonable temperatures we have been experiencing lately. The unseasonable seemed unreasonable in late September and forecasted for early October. It's too hot – summer is still here! It didn't used to be like this! Early autumn isn't what we think it *should* be! Where is FALL???

How easily we go from joyful, beautiful daydreams to gripe sessions in less than a minute, even with trivial concerns that cannot compare to those of major importance – like health, safety, and homelessness. The complaints of the present soon overshadow the joys and hope of things to come. The darkness of the shadow is like a heavy blanket we pull over ourselves that blocks the light of hope, and restricts our breathing to what small amount of air the shroud permits in that small, dark space. We go from the dreams of what could or should be in the future to the reality of the present, and then to the misguided assumption that the situation is hopeless.

Yes, misguided.

We have been looking at the book of Jeremiah for several weeks, now. Jeremiah weeps so much because the people of Judah won't come out from under that blanket of darkness. They suffer and complain about how things should be and how hopeless things are having relied on the earthly and idolatrous beliefs rather than God. Numerous times, God through Jeremiah implores them to lift their blankets and turn to the light of God, the balm in Gilead, the Great Physician, who can heal them and give them hope. They can go from sin, suffering and lamentations to repentance, forgiveness, regeneration, and the hope for a better future. In fact, with God, they can plan for that good future.



I plan on true autumn weather arriving and all the wonderful things that come with it. My faith gives me that hope.

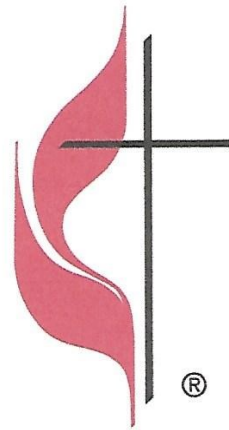

We as Langhorne UMC must do the same in regard to the global UMC and our own local church. Enjoy all the wondrous things of autumn, and the hope of things to come from God for you and God's holy Church.

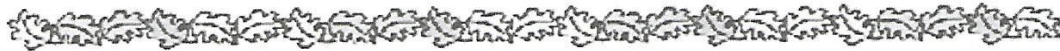

(Interfaith observance is Oct. 18-20)

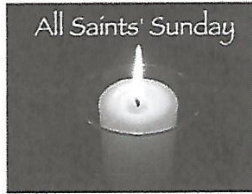

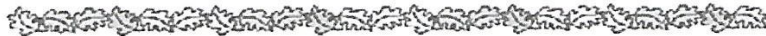
November 3 – All Saints Sunday!

A note to the Members of LUMC

The Trustees have notified the church that the parsonage is in need of a new roof, gutters and garage doors. There is no money in the budget for this. Cost is \$30-35,000.00.

We currently have \$19,000 in this account which will be used towards the parsonage roof, gutters and garage doors. The projected cost is \$30-35,000. So we will have a deficit.

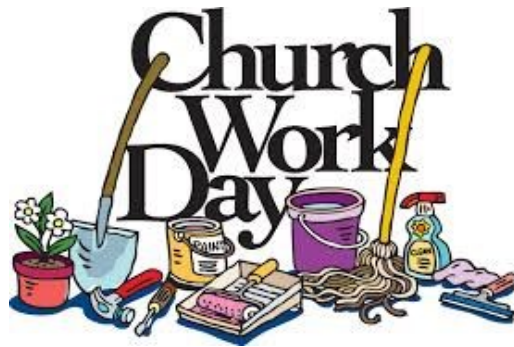

A Program of Prison Fellowship

All across the nation, churches are gearing up for another Angel Tree® Christmas season and so are we. We have registered again this year with the intent of providing a special Christmas for **20 children in our area** who have an incarcerated parent.

For the past four Christmases we have helped brighten the lives of **local children** of incarcerated parents through Angel Tree, a program of Prison Fellowship®. The Christmas component of the ministry encompasses the purchasing, wrapping, and delivering gifts to prisoners' children on their incarcerated parents' behalf. This delivers not only a message of love from parent to child, but also the true meaning of Christmas—the Good News of Jesus Christ.

But the Angel Tree ministry doesn't end with Christmas. Our hope is that our first Christmas connection will be the beginning of a rewarding, ongoing relationship with these children and their families. We have been working on continuing our Angel Tree ministry throughout the year and asking God to use our church to help these children and their families grow in their faith, strengthen their family relationships, and fulfill the purposes that God has for their lives.

Why Is Men's Ministry Important?¹

- Men lead others best by modeling Jesus Christ in thoughts, words and deeds.
- Spiritual maturity is signified in spiritual reproduction, as the faith of mature disciples passes on in others.
- Men growing in Christ become effective spiritual leaders in their homes and congregations, working as partners with their spouses and congregational leaders—both lay and clergy.
- Spiritually growing men help congregations to become vital and alive.
- Everything desired from and through men comes as a result of men growing spiritually and maturing as disciples: family blessings, stewardship, service, outreach, prayer, spiritual leadership, lifestyle evangelism, and faithful obedience. Men are foundational to the life and health of the church.
- When a man lives daily in surrendered faith, God is honored and many lives are blessed. Transformed hearts are forged only within Christ-centered lives—nothing less is our acceptable offering; nothing less truly reveals Christ.

Leading By Example exists to serve our Lord Jesus Christ in self, family, church, community and workplace; to empower men through spiritual growth as devoted disciples of the risen Christ; and to provide a supportive community environment where men are free to unburden themselves in the presence of one another.

Each year our Living Nativity brings the love of the Christmas Story to our community. This annual event is much loved and anticipated.

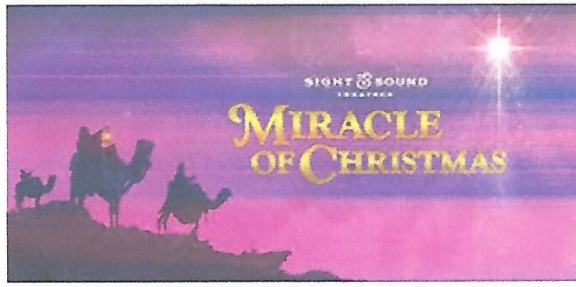
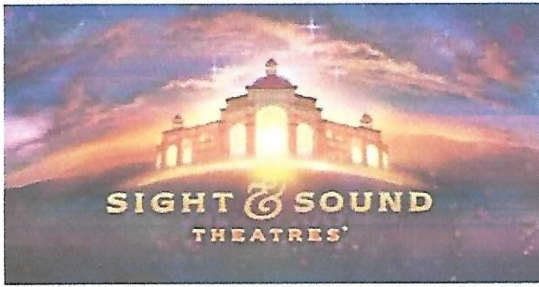
LUMC will again be sponsoring a living nativity this year.
