A Note from your Pastor, Rev. Laurie J. Pfahler...

Greetings in the Name of the Son, For Whom We Are Truly Grateful!!

"Now thank we all our God, with heart and hands and voices, Who wondrous things has done, in whom this world rejoices; Who from our mothers' arms has blessed us on our way With countless gifts of love, and still is ours today."



The month of November generally has four days we set aside to observe: All Saints Day; Election Day; Veterans' Day; and, of course, Thanksgiving Day. Other lesser known days in November include World Community Day; International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church; Bible Sunday along with National Bible Week; and a couple of United Methodist days of observance – Organ & Tissue Donor Sunday, and United Methodist Student Sunday. Not to mention all the days, "official" or not, that we hear about via social and news media, like National Clean-Out-Your-Refrigerator Day, and yes, even National Pizza-With-the-Works-Except-Anchovies Day. And then there is the day known as "Black Friday..."

Sadly, folks may tend to remember the latter three days because of personal relevance, and forget the others of social and faith based importance. And how many of you know that the entire month of November is Native American Heritage Month?

And in the short time it took for you to read thus far, your mind is probably focused on things other than giving thanks to God, despite the fact that I started my note with gratitude for Christ and our thanks for blessings from God. We are so easily distracted...

Personal relevance - - What do we allow in this world to stimulate our minds and senses to the point of distraction? What takes us away from the moral, the ethical, the spiritual, the loving of our neighbor, and the loving of our God? It has to do with personal relevance. If cleaning is relevant to you, "your thing," then a day devoted to cleaning out the refrigerator may not be a bad thing to set aside a day for. And heaven KNOWS I am all for enjoying what God has given us, and having fun along the way with the occasional pizza, but I have to remember to thank God for the gift; and to still love God and neighbor in all I say and do. November 12, 2017 - Organ Donation Sunday | National Donor Sabbath What is the United Methodist view on organ donation?

United Methodists take a very proactive stand to encourage organ donation. Our Social Principles state:

"We believe that organ transplantation and organ donation are acts of charity, agape love, and self-sacrifice. We recognize the life-giving benefits of organ and other tissue donation and encourage all people of faith to become organ and tissue donors as a part of their love and ministry to others in need. We urge that it be done in an environment of respect for deceased and living donors and for the benefit of the recipients, and following protocols that carefully prevent abuse to donors and their families. " (¶ 162 (W)).

As a way to embody this stand in our corporate worship life, General Conference 2000 urged all United Methodist congregations to celebrate "Organ Donation Sunday" on the second Sunday prior to Thanksgiving week, which is recognized in interfaith circles in the U.S. as "National Donor Sabbath." (See Book of Resolutions 2012, pp. 439-440).



Our Church Finances Finance Committee, Chuck Boyle, Chairperson September 2017

In the month of September our revenue fell below expectations because of the general offering coming in \$2,100 less than what we had budgeted for the month but on the expense side we exceeded expectations for the month by spending \$5,000 less than our budget. The year-to-date financial picture continues to be positive. Our revenues are ahead of expectations and our operating expenses are below expectations. Our bottom line is showing a small gain. Typically at this time of the year we carry a significant negative bottom line, but this year we are doing much better. Thanks go out to our loving congregation. This picture could change, but for now we are looking financially stable.

For the year-to-date on the revenue side our total revenues equaled \$233,600, which is \$1,600 above our budget, which is good. The major differences between our budget and actual revenue are noted below:

- 1. Total offerings are over budget by \$4,100. The main reason for this was a generous and much appreciated offering of \$6,000. Please keep in mind that large offerings like this cannot be counted on every month.
- 2. The Wednesday night dinners have generated \$1,200 more than what was budgeted.
- 3. Investment returns from the McKay Fund are \$1,400 less than budget. We have checked with the Trustees and they co firmed that there have not been any changes in the way this fund is invested. This may be a reflection of over budgeting a bit.
- 4. Facility usage fees are \$1,000 below budget. This is due to a lack of use of our church for weddings, personal gatherings, etc.
- 5. Fellowship and refreshment giving is \$300 less than budgeted.
- 6. Gifting for the altar flowers is \$300 less than budgeted.
- 7. Sunday school offering is \$300 less than budgeted.

On the expense side for the year we reported total expense of \$232,500, which is \$21,000 under budget. The major differences between our budget and actual expenses are noted below:

- 1. The Missions Conference was not held this year resulting in a \$600 reduction in expense.
- 2. Our previous Youth Director volunteered to generously donate his services to our church and we had no compensation expense over the summer as the SPRC worked on filling this valued staff position, resulting in a savings of \$7,400.
- 3. Utility expenses are currently \$7,500 below our budget.
- 4. Pastor compensation is \$5,700 less than budget due to the change in leadership.
- 5. Church secretary compensation is \$400 less than budget.
- 6. Social security tax expense is \$600 less than budget due to a decrease in total staff compensation expense.
- 7. Altar flower expense is \$200 more than budget.
- 8. Moving expenses for Pastor John were \$800, which was not in our budget.

9. Payments made to the Methodist Conference are \$500 less than budget because of the change pastors.


This leaves us with a year to date net operating gain of \$1,100. This is good as we had budgeted a loss of \$21,500 for this period. This small bottom line gain should hold through the rest of this year if we continue to control our expenditures and catch up on the offerings that were missed over the summer when many of us were away.

As of the end of September we have \$51,200 in the L.U.M.C. general fund. This is the financial cushion that we need to move forward. Our cash position has decreased over the summer because of our offerings decreasing.

The Reserve Giving Fund continues to grow nicely thanks to our congregation. As of the end of August the balance in this fund is \$8,400.
