

Langhorne UMC Friendly Voice – Sept. 2018 1 Pastor's Message



September 1, 2018

Dear People of Langhorne United Methodist Church,

You may recall a letter and information I put together for a previous Friendly Voice that spoke about the Way Forward Commission's task to come up with a way for the entire United Methodist Church (UMC), worldwide, to go forward in light of the questions and beliefs regarding practicing homosexuals (that is people in same-gendered sexual relationships whether married or not) as pastors; and whether or not the UMC should permit its pastors to conduct same-gendered marriages and/or to allow such marriages to take place on UMC property. At present, our Book of Discipline prohibits all three from taking place, basing its stance on specific scriptures.

The United Methodist Church is at odds with itself with some believing we should remain prohibitive and faithful to the present Book of Discipline, and others who believe that a lot of what we have accepted in the Bible has changed because of cultural changes over the millennia, and that change is necessary again to be inclusive of the LGBTQI* community, and their lives as members of and servants in the United Methodist Church. This group also cites scripture to support its stance.

There are three plan options that have been developed that will be reviewed and voted on in that February 23-26, 2019 general conference. What happens at that conference – whatever plan option they vote on and approve through our democratic process will have a dramatic effect our United Methodist Church. The plan options are:

- The Traditional Plan "affirms the current Book of Discipline language about homosexuality, prohibiting ordination and same-gender marriages or unions of homosexual persons. Places a high value on accountability and enforcement."
- The One Church Plan "Removes all of the restrictive language in the Book of Discipline about homosexuality, ordination and same-gender marriages/unions. Has a high value on contextualization. Protects the rights of those whose conscience will not allow them to perform same gender weddings or ordain LGBTQ** persons."

 Connectional Conference Plan – "Has one 'core' that includes shared doctrine and services. Creates different 'branches' that have clearly defined values. These values include: accountability, contextualization and justice."

Each of these three plans/models

- "represents values that are within the Council of Bishops and the UMC"
- "includes a gracious way to exit from the denomination for those who feel called to do so"
- "includes Biblical theology and mission"¹

On August 14, 2018, the Way Forward Commission published a final report in preparation (for all the UMC as well as delegates – see the 3rd link below) for the special General Conference to be held February 23-26, 2019. This report is lengthy (93 pages), but is sectioned so that you can get the information you need to understand it.

What YOU CAN DO UNTIL February 23rd - -

PRAY – Pray for the United Methodist Church. Pray for the delegates who must vote on all our behalf. Pray for the peace and love of Christ to be evident in its presence at the conference and not overshadowed by anxieties, anger, and impatience during the discussions. Pray each day – the literature asks that each day up to and including the conference that we all pray every day between 2:23p and 2:26p (it corresponds with the numbers of the February dates! ⁽³⁾).

TALK ABOUT THIS – Talk about this in your families, small group church gatherings, Bible studies and Sunday school and listen to everyone's opinions and feelings. Do not dismiss your own feelings even if strong people push one thought or the other that may be different from your own. True love is never wrong because true love is God. This is a step towards understanding each other no matter what the decision of the conference vote will be.

See the attached outline for additional things you may do until Feb. 23.

Be faithful, my dear congregation. God has a plan for each of us no matter what is decided at the general conference in February. PLEASE LOOK AT THE THREE OPTIONS and be praying and thinking about what LANHORNE UMC should do – with God's guidance – under all of the three plans, and what you and your family will need to do should you disagree with the decision of the conference delegates and/or the Langhorne UMC in response to that voted general conference decision.

The Way Forward for The United Methodist Church Information (Background & Updates)

i

The United Methodist Church Book of Discipline, Paragraph 161g:

"The United Methodist Church does not condone the practice of homosexuality and considers this practice incompatible with Christian teaching."

Ordained Ministry – Paragraph 304.3

"The practice of homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching. Therefore selfavowed practicing homosexuals are not to be certified as candidates, ordained as ministers or appointed to serve in the United Methodist Church."

Marriage – Paragraph 161c

"We affirm the sanctity of the marriage covenant that is expressed in love, mutual support, personal commitment, and shared fidelity between a man and a woman. We support laws in civil society that define marriage as the union of one man and one woman."

Unauthorized Conduct – Paragraph 341.6

"Ceremonies that celebrate homosexual unions shall not be conducted by our ministers and shall not be conducted in our churches."

Chargeable Offenses – Paragraph 2702.1 (a) (b)

"A clergy member...may be tried when charged with one or more of the following offenses (a) immorality including but not limited to, not being celibate in singleness or not faithful in a heterosexual marriage, (b) practices declared by the United Methodist church to be incompatible with Christian teachings, including but not limited to: being a self-avowed practicing homosexual or conducting ceremonies which celebrate homosexual unions; or performing same-sex wedding ceremonies..."

Since 1972...

These paragraphs have been debated and voted again and again

At every General Conference since these paragraphs have been challenged but in general they have stayed the same with the exception of some additions about "God's grace is available for all" "we implore families and churches not to reject or condemn lesbians and gay members and friends."

General Conference, Portland, Oregon, May 10-20, 2016

Authorized (by 23 votes) the Council of Bishops to create a Special Commission on A Way Forward"

- All legislation regarding homosexuality was suspended.
- A commission of 32 people was created to study the issue in depth and bring to the bishops a plan.
- The commission consisted of a wide variety of diversity: ethnically, gender, orientation, theological, lay and clergy.
- The 2012 Discipline would stay in place while the commission did its work.

Vision of the Commission

• To design a way for being church that maximizes the presence of the UM witness in as many places in the world as possible, that allows for as much contextual differentiation as possible and balances an approach to different theological understanding of human sexuality with a desire for as much unity as possible. • ...This unity will not be grounded in our conceptions of human sexuality but in our affirmation of the Triune God who calls us to be a grace-filled and holy people in the Wesleyan tradition."

Process

- Undergirded with an intentional and global prayer effort.
- Study of the scriptures.
- Presentations by theologians, historians, financial leaders, other denominations.
- Hearing from agencies, boards, churches.
- Much conversation and sharing of hearts and perspectives.

Meetings

- The Commission met 9 times in person.
- The Commission lived together with a "Covenant of Accountability" mandating respect, prayer, study, hospitality, and confidentiality.
- The Commission identified behaviors that needed to be avoided (harmful speech, interrupting others, blaming, distracting, politicizing).

The Commission presented three alternative "sketches" to the bishops in November 2017. They became "models" in early 2018 and have since been finalized as plans:

Traditional Plan

- Affirms the current Book of Discipline language about homosexuality, prohibiting ordination and same-gender marriages or unions of homosexual persons.
- Places a high value on accountability and enforcement.

One Church Plan

- Removes all of the restrictive language in the Book of Discipline about homosexuality, ordination and same-gender marriages/unions.
- Has a high value on contextualization.
- Protects the rights of those whose conscience will not allow them to perform same gender weddings or ordain LGBTQ persons.

Connectional Conference Plan

- Has one "core" that includes shared doctrine and services.
- Creates different "branches" that have clearly defined values.
- These values include: accountability, contextualization and justice.

What the models/plans have in common:

- Each represents values that are within the Council of Bishops and the UMC.
- Each includes a gracious way to exit from the denomination for those who feel called do so.
- Each includes Biblical theology and mission.

Council of Bishops

The Council of Bishops is not planning on schism and believes that unity is our best witness. Conferences are encouraged to study the book *Anatomy of Peace*, by the Arbinger Institute, and have conversations locally.

The values of our global church are reflected in all three plans. But the

majority of the Council of Bishops recommends the One Church Plan as the best way forward for The United Methodist Church.

• It allows for contextualization of language about human sexuality in support of our common mission.

• It allows for central conferences, especially those in Africa, to retain their traditional language and values.

• It best fulfills the vision of a global and multicultural Church in order to maximize our mission and achieve as much unity as possible.

It keeps the constitution and the structure and agencies intact.

- It does not force anyone to act outside of their conscience.
- It received the overwhelming majority in the COB's support.
- It has the most space, clarity, grace, context and simplicity.

• It takes out the language from the Discipline about homosexuality and samegender weddings. Instead, it allows churches and pastors to decide about hosting and conducting weddings; and it allows conferences and their boards of ordained ministry to decide about ordination and commissioning of LGBT clergy.

Special General Conference

- There will be 864 delegates ($\frac{1}{2}$ lay and $\frac{1}{2}$ clergy) from the entire denomination
- 42% of the voting delegates are from countries other than the US
- 30% of the delegates are from the continent of Africa
- The majority of the US delegates are from the southeast and south central jurisdictions.
- Eastern PA has 8 delegates, Pen-Del has 4 delegates.
- Local conversations are encouraged.

Timeline

- Bishop Peggy Johnson will update Way Forward developments, review the three study commission plans and invite questions and comments at four district town hall meetings in the fall.
- Sept. 22 the NEJ delegations will meet for instructions and conversation.
- At is regular October meeting, the Judicial Council will review the 2019 Special GC documents and rule on the constitutionality of the three submitted plans.
- General Conference will be held in St. Louis, Mo., February 23-26, 2019. The result of its vote on the way forward goes into effect immediately.

What to do In the meantime:

- Be an unanxious presence, holding fast to "the peace that surpasses understanding."
- Have conversations, prayer meetings, Bible study. (Resources are on conference websites.)
- Join our special prayer emphasis: Pray every day from 2:23 pm to 2:26 pm (and a.m. if you are up late). These are the dates of the General Conference in February.
- Engage in the Wesley Fast (from sundown on Thursday until 3 PM Friday)
- Have an attitude of "Convicted Humility"

Convicted Humility is an attitude which combines honesty about the differing convictions which divide us with humility about the ways in which each of our views may stand in need of correction. It also involves humble repentance for all the ways in which we have spoken and acted as those seeking to win a fight rather than those called to discern the shape for faithfulness together. In that spirit, we wish to lift up our sacred core commitments which define the Wesleyan movement and ground our search for wisdom and holiness.

Stewardship Thought

Are You a Volunteer... Or a Steward? Is there a difference?



While preparing for a recent workshop hosted by our Stewardship Committee, I started a list of the benefits of volunteering. It didn't take long for the list to grow with the expected positives: networking, meeting new people, making a difference in someone's life... I am sure you can start your own list as most of us volunteer. We are taught from an early age that volunteering is a good way to "give back".

All of these positives are great reasons to volunteer, so you can imagine my shock when I learned at the Stewardship Workshop* that volunteering is *not* the same as practicing Christian stewardship! God calls each of us to use our gifts and talents to build up the Kingdom of God. It is fine to volunteer, however, volunteering is not necessarily practicing stewardship. Stewardship is living out our life to be more like Christ. Put that way, the commitment to volunteer seems easy, right?

The origin of stewardship is in the Old Testament with the first fruits, or first portion of the harvest given back to God. The first step of becoming a steward involves making a decision to follow Christ, no matter what the cost. When God calls us to be a steward, we respond - regardless of the price. Once we grow our faith and accept that challenge, we then have a choice to make, a conscious decision that orientates us towards our own individual set of talents. This takes us away from the usual routine of what we always do, and allows us to then commit our very best self to the Lord. Practicing stewardship becomes a way of life, using our own God-given talents. It is not an endless calendar of duties or events. This new faith opens up for us a new vision, transforming us and our world in a way that mirrors the Kingdom of God. We are becoming mature disciples!

Langhorne United Methodist Church Children's Ministries, including VBS and Sunday School Instructions for Adult Volunteer Background Checks

Thank you for serving in the ministry of Langhorne UMC. It's our goal to maintain a safe and healthy environment for all participants whether child or staff. **Pennsylvania Law** requires background checks on all adults (volunteer or paid) working with children and youth.

The following three background checks are required to serve:

- PA State Police Criminal Record Check (Form SP 4-164A) Background check fees for volunteers are waived one time within a 5-year period, otherwise it costs \$22.
- Child Abuse History Certification (DPW) (Form CY-113) Background check fees for volunteers are waived one time within a 5-year period, otherwise it costs \$8.
- FBI Background Check Fingerprinting (Federal Criminal History Record) Cost is \$23.

UNLESS... you are a continuous resident of Pennsylvania for the past 10 years.

AND... affirm in writing (<u>FBI Fingerprint Wavier</u>) that you are not disqualified from service based upon a conviction of an offense under §6344 that prohibits service with children. **THEN...** you do not need to be fingerprinted, just submit the Wavier to the church office.

NOTE: Background checks must be dated within 5 years of your date of service date & on file at the church office.

If you already have current (*issued within the last 5 years*) background checks from your place of work, you may submit copies to the church office instead of applying for new background checks.

1. <u>PA State Police Criminal Record Check</u> - Obtain online at the PA State Police Website: (https://epatch.state.pa.us/Home.jsp). Click the "New Record Check (Volunteers Only)." After receiving your results, remember to click on the Control Number and print the "Certification" page.

2. <u>Child Abuse History Certification</u> - Obtain online at the PA Child Welfare Portal: (https://www.compass.state.pa.us/CWIS). You will need to create an online account. You'll receive an email saying certification is being reviewed. You'll receive a 2nd email saying it is complete with a link to click to print the certificate.

3. *FBI Background Check* (fingerprinting) – The Pennsylvania Department of Human Services utilizes IndentoGo by IDEMIA to process fingerprint-based FBI criminal background checks. The fingerprint based background check is a multiple step process.

Appointments to be fingerprinted are not required, but **pre-registration** is required. Once registered, you may walk-in during a location's posted hours of operation, but scheduling an appointment may lead to lesser/no wait times.

In order to pre-register for a FBI background check and/or find a fingerprinting location, applicants should access the IDEMIA website (<u>https://www.identogo.com</u>) for a service location and hours.

IDEMIA uses service codes when identifying the authorized purpose for why an applicant is being fingerprinted. This ensures applicants are processed for the correct purpose and agency.

Under "Enter your Service Code to get started," volunteers enter **1KG6ZJ**. You will be taken to a form where you can fill out your information. Once your information is submitted, you will be taken to an appointment scheduling page. You will receive your certification in a few weeks by mail.




Directions: Each of the six scrambled words has a connection with each other. That connection is revealed in the two-word solution below that must be unscrambled using the letters in the shaded boxes.
