

Pastor's Message for October



When I was little, our family would take Sunday afternoon rides in the hills around Morris County, NJ. It was a great combination of small suburban and rural towns; farmlands and forests; and the occasional Stewart's Root Beer establishment where we would stop and get car window service of hot dogs, fries, root beer, and orange soda. I thought that was SO COOL! (And no, the waiters and waitresses were not on roller skates.)

While the stop at Stewart's seemed to be the highlight for my brother and me, we often had fun at the farm markets we would stop at on each of those weekly afternoon trips. In October and into November, we got to pick out our own special apple and on rare occasions, THAT apple could be either a candy-apple or a caramel apple (sometimes with crushed peanuts!! WOW!!). What a treat! In the meantime, Mom would be making arrangements for a large basket of apples, a bag of corn, and squash; plus whatever else was needed in the way of fresh vegetables and fruit. If it were August or early September, we feasted on peaches; and in June and July, it was strawberries, raspberries and blueberries.

Until my oldest sister was married in 1967, we were a family of seven; so buying and cooking in quantity was what my parents did. And while such amazing gifts of the earth were well enjoyed by the Pfahler household, there were other reasons we took these weekly Sunday afternoon drives. Mom and Dad wanted us to have some family time and see the world around us. We piled into the station wagon and we watched the seasons change and nature unfold around us. We saw villages of squirrels and maple tree taps; waterfalls and beaver dams; cows and calves – LOTS of cows and calves; horses; deer; eagles, hawks, woodpeckers, and wild turkeys. These, too, are amazing gifts of the earth. God gave us all these wonderful things: food, the world around us, and family in whatever forms they come in. And God gave all this to us because of God's great love for us.

I am reminded often of the praises and thanksgivings lifted in the Psalms. Psalm 104 comes to mind as God the Creator and Provider and speaks of much of what I have related here. God needs to be recognized and credited for all that we enjoy and reap on this earth; for all that we are as the family of God.

"Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain."

(Ps. 127:1a NRSV)

So as we watch the turning of the leaves, sip that cider, and eat that pumpkin pie in this harvest time, remember just how blessed we are to have God as our Father and the love that God bestows upon us each and every day of the year.

Today, as God's children, we deem God the source of all we have, seek to hold it in trust for God and desire to be "good stewards of the manifold grace of God." (1 Peter 4:10a)

We Give

To belong to our congregation is to be a steward. Some may say that "stewardship" is just a polite way of referring to financial giving to the church. But it's far more than that.

One character in some of Jesus' parables is the steward — the servant charged by the master to care for the master's property. It is the master, not the steward, who owns the property, but the steward is responsible for it and is accountable to the master. So it is, said Jesus, between God and us. As God's stewards we have three responsibilities:

Receiving: We receive with joyful thanksgiving the many gifts that God showers upon us — time, talent, treasure, our bodies, our friendships, natural resources, and the beauty around us.

Managing: We take good care of what we have received. We manage these resources wisely — for our own good and the good of others.

Giving: Out of our gratitude in receiving so abundantly, we want to share with others. Let's look at four kinds of gifts that we receive, manage, and share:

Our time

We did nothing to earn the hours, the days, the weeks of our lives. Time is a gift of God. How we choose to use it is a matter of stewardship. Some people lead lives of frenetic activity, always over-extending themselves to the point of exhaustion, while others sit around in apathetic boredom. Some spend all their hours serving the needs of others at the expense of their own, while others live only for themselves.

As Christian stewards we try to manage time wisely and in a balanced way. And we give our time gladly to family and friends, to strangers, to the community, the church, and to ourselves.

Our abilities

Do you remember Jesus' parable of the three servants who received different amounts of money to manage while the master was away? We've each received from God distinctive gifts and talents. How we develop and use these talents is a matter of stewardship. Like two of the servants in Jesus' story, we can invest them wisely — or like the third, out of fear we can hide them (Matthew 25:14-30).

As stewards, we acknowledge the gifts we have without apology. We develop them further, practicing new skills and putting our talents to work in ministry.

Our resources

We may think that our financial resources are our own. But when we recall that the time, the energy, the good health, and the opportunities for employment behind these dollars are all gifts from God, we see that the funds belong to God too. We are the stewards; God is the owner. So questions about what we earn, how we earn it, how we save, spend, and give it away, are all questions of Christian stewardship.

One vital aspect of our stewardship is our giving to Christ's work in the world. We've learned that giving is most effective when we commit ourselves to give a definite proportion of our income through the church. For many, this proportion is one-tenth, or a tithe. Whatever the amount, we have discovered the joy in giving to God the "first fruits," an amount "off the top" of our income, not what's left over at the end of the month.





# **CODE BLUE Needs for the 2018-2019 Winter Season by AHTN**

& Those in Need

Advocates for Homeless & Those in Need provides a Code Blue Shelter to the homeless each year from Dec. 1st through March 31st when the temperature outside reaches 26 degrees or lower (*with windchill*).

This year will be AHTN's 10th Code Blue season. Last season they opened 67 nights and served 158 individual guests here in the Lower Bucks County area.

When a guest arrives to an AHTN shelter they are given a cot to sleep on with bedding, dinner & breakfast provided by the church and resources on how they can try to get out of their current situation and other free services available to them.

***At times, AHTN guests come into the Code Blue shelter and are in need of dry, warm clothing due to the elements outside. This is where AHTN needs our support!***

AHTN is in need of the following items for this Code Blue season:

- New or Gently Used Waterproof Gloves
- New or Gently Used Thermal Underwear (sizes med through 2XL)
- New or Gently Used Hooded sweatshirts (sizes med through 2XL)
- New or Gently Used Sweatpants (Sizes medium through 2XL)
- NEW Deodorant

NEW Underwear (for both Men & Woman)
