

Greetings!

Fall is finally here. I don't usually rush seasons. In fact, I complain about how fast time flies every month. But this year, I was yearning for the cool days of autumn... the changing colors of the trees against a clear blue sky... the rustle of leaves under my feet...



hooded sweatshirts and cardigan sweaters... fresh local apples and cider... hayrides and campfires... mums and pumpkins...

My vision of autumn changed to impatience over the last three weeks of September elevating almost as high as the unseasonable temperatures we have been experiencing lately. The unseasonable seemed unreasonable in late September and forecasted for early October. It's too hot – summer is still here! It didn't used to be like this! Early autumn isn't what we think it should be! Where is FALL???

How easily we go from joyful, beautiful daydreams to gripe sessions in less than a minute, even with trivial concerns that cannot compare to those of major importance like health, safety, and homelessness. The complaints of the present soon overshadow the joys and hope of things to come. The darkness of the shadow is like a heavy blanket we pull over ourselves that blocks the light of hope, and restricts our breathing to what small amount of air the shroud permits in that small, dark space. We go from the dreams of what could or should be in the future to the reality of the present, and then to the misguided assumption that the situation is hopeless.

Yes, misguided.

We have been looking at the book of Jeremiah for several weeks, now. Jeremiah weeps

so much because the people of Judah won't come out from under that blanket of darkness. They suffer and complain about how things should be and how hopeless things are having relied on the earthly and idolatrous beliefs rather than God. Numerous times, God through Jeremiah implores them to lift their blankets and turn to the light of God, the balm in

Gilead, the Great Physician, who can heal them and give them hope. They can go from sin, suffering and lamentations to repentance, forgiveness, regeneration, and the hope for a better future. In fact, with God, they can plan for that good future.

I plan on true autumn weather arriving and all the wonderful things that come with it. My faith gives me that hope.

As the United Methodist Church moves forward, we live in the hope of a good future and are planning for it because our faith in God assures us of those good things to come. We as Langhorne UMC must do the same in regard to the global UMC and our own local church. It is time for everyone to take off that blanket of darkness and see the light of hope that is God - our God has a plan for us. Let us be ready, and plan for God's plan!

Enjoy all the wondrous things of autumn, and the hope of things to come from God for you and God's holy Church.







A note to the Members of LUMC

The Trustees have notified the church that the parsonage is in need of a new roof, gutters and garage doors. There is no money in the budget for this. Cost is \$30-35,000.00.

We currently have \$19,000 in this account which will be used towards the parsonage roof, gutters and garage doors. The projected cost is \$30-35,000. So we will have a deficit.
