Summer Greetings from Your Pastor!!

Somehow, despite the overly rainy late winter and most of the spring, flowers are popping up and out most places you look. But gardeners and lawn enthusiasts will speak up and exclaim, "...and so are the weeds!" Just ask those who have volunteered as our "garden angels" who take care of areas around our church!!

Weeds are what we "weed" out of the lawns and gardens and are what we define them to be, for the most part. Some gardeners will weed out the old plants, or some plants that have taken over in greater number than is desired for that plot of earth. When it comes right down to it, we weed out all that is undesirable, by our standards, in our gardens and lawns. We want to be rid of them because we think they do not belong. They do not fit in with what we want our piece of earth to be or are any benefit to anything or anybody. Out of sight, out of mind...



Take the dandelion – up until sometime in the 1800's, it was cultivated for its dietary and medicinal values, and it was and still is one of several flowering plants vital to bees. It blooms early when the bees are just coming out and stays in bloom well into fall. Grass was removed to make room for the dandelions. But the popular culture changed when someone decided that residential and some commercial landscapes should be "coiffed," lush and green. And gardens were to be groomed well with gorgeous colorful blooms and things that smelled lovely. Dandelions needed to be weeded out for fear they would choke out all other desired grasses and plants. They are prolific and it is assumed by many people that taking over everything is the dandelion's sole mission. They are considered a threat to the property and the neighborhood. Property values are higher if the neighborhood homes all have high curb appeal.

However, dandelions and other "weeds" are vital pieces of the environmental system. And if important to the environmental system, the weeds are important to us.

Unfortunately, there are people who transferred this kind of thinking to their country, their towns and neighborhoods, and even their churches when it comes to people. The extreme has been genocide; followed by non-existent or minimal human and civil rights, segregation, and all forms of abuse. All of this is founded on the basis of fear, hate, and false information that leads to misunderstanding, assumption, prejudice, and bigotry. People worry about their property value going down or up when certain types of people move in or out. The thing is, like weeds, ALL types of people - - ALL, like you and me, like weeds and even desirable plants - - can become invasive; and where is the diversity in that? We can be overgrown with too many lily of the valley!! Where is the true body of Christ when all are only hands?

Are there people in our church you avoid, will not sit with, do not speak with? Why or why not? Aside from those with malicious intent, are there people outside of church that you would not want to come to our church? Why? Are there issues that stand between you and others like heavy walls that need breaking down so that grace can be shared and forgiveness can take place?

Do you always sit in the same spot and with the same people when you come to worship? Do you fellowship before and after the worship services? And do you sit and share with the same people?

Lily of the valley are awesome; and if that were all that God had to offer, I would be happy. But God loves diversity and gives us all types of people to live, love, and work with; and my life garden and yard, our church, and the body of Christ is made better with a variety of God's children in it.



Change it up people! ^(C) Sit with folks you don't usually sit with in church and in fellowship, or in the workplace. Get to know them, and let them know you. And if you haven't been to church in a while, come on home, people! We need to reacquaint ourselves and get you involved again in fellowship and the family here at LUMC.

We are all flowers, even if we are dandelions. There are no "weeds" as we humans have defined them. We are all part of God's amazing garden. Let us all grow together!!






