

Greetings, and Happy New Year!

Yes, Happy New Year! I say that for a couple of reasons:

- 1. In our country we all tend to look at September as the start of a new year for school students and Sunday schools, and that has tended to shape our church schedules into starting new things in the fall as well. People are ending vacations and the summer, and are gearing up for re-
- entry into the normal routine and preparing for the holidays to come. And... 2. Looking at our Judeo-Christian heritage, 2019 Rosh Hashanah begins before sundown on Sunday, September 29th and ends before nightfall on October 1st. It is the start of the Jewish New Year and is closely followed by 2019 Yom Kippur, the



Day of Atonement, sundown October 8 to nightfall October 9.

Rosh Hashanah covers the first two full days of the new year. It actually means "Head of the Year," and what Jews do and how they act on Rosh Hashanah is said to have a big impact on the rest of the year, just like the head/brain has an impact on the rest of the body. For the Jewish community during this time, "all inhabitants of the world pass before (God) like a flock of sheep..." and decisions are made in heaven about the future of each person. While prayers continue year round, Rosh Hashanah is a time for deep intentional prayers for peace and blessings, and praise of God to proclaim "(God) as King of the universe." The ten days after Rosh Hashanah, before Yom Kippur, are referred to as the "Ten Days of Repentance" or "Ten Days of Return" before atonement takes place. This time is a "return" to, or reconciliation with God in sincere repentance of one's sins, and is the time when each draws closer and closer to God. Rosh Hashanah and the Ten Days of Repentence/Return usher in the holiest day of the Jewish year, Yom Kippur.

Yom Kippur (Yom = Day of; Kippur = Atonement), is the day when Jews are closest to God, and to who they really are in their very souls. "In the seventh month, on the tenth day of the month, you shall deny yourselves, and shall do no work, neither the citizen nor the alien who resides among you. For on this day atonement shall be made for you, to cleanse you; from all your sins you shall be clean before the Lord." (Lev. 16:29-30 NRSV) For the almost 26 hours of Yom Kippur, their time in spent in the synagogue abstaining from food and drink, washing/bathing, lotions/creams, wearing leather shoes, and marital relations so that time is spent in prayer asking for forgiveness. The very first Yom Kippur happened with Moses. After the people sinned in their worship of the golden calf, Moses ascended Mount Sinai and prayed to God to forgive them. After two 40-day periods on the mountain, day Moses came down having received the forgiveness of God for the people, and their relationship reconciled: That was their first Day of Atonement / Yom Kippur.

So what? What does that have to do with us today as Christians?



Well - - let's not forget that Jesus was Jewish. He was a rebel by today's standards (or labels), and as his Trinitarian identity was making its presence known bit by bit in his ministry here on earth, he was also exposing and teaching what needed to change with Jewish belief in his time then AND going forward in our lives today, even though we are Christians. What was important to stress between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur was the need for the Jews to be close to God, to confess and repent their sins, and to do their part to atone/reconcile their relationship with God so that they can be forgiven and washed clean of their sins. Sound familiar?

As Christians, Jesus has taught us that the relationship with God is key, and to maintain that relationship with love is the strongest and most valuable of any relationship. And while special days are great for reflections and deep prayers about our lives and how we live (or do NOT live), he made it clear that God is ALWAYS available. God's grace surrounds us and because of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, forgiveness, total cleansing, and atonement is just a heartbeat away! Lent, Holy Week with Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday seem to be the closest version of designated days for personal reflection, confession, and repentance we have to Rosh Hashanah and the Ten Days of Repentance/Return. But the difference is Easter! Because of Easter, our day of atonement (Yom Kippur) can be any day or moment of the year! We are Easter people - for us, Easter is every day! Every time we open ourselves to God to confess and repent, we receive that grace that cleanses and forgives and makes us anew! It is a new day, a new year every time we are reconciled with God!!

> So, HAPPY NEW YEAR everyone!! Happy LIFE ANEW everyday all because of Jesus Christ!!
